4. Discuss the news
5. Read an English article & summarise it in French

What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class?

- The WEA tutor will use a range of different teaching and learning methods and encourage you

and the group to be actively involved in your learning

- Students will be given homework on a weekly basis

What kind of feedback can I expect from the tutor?

- A range of informal activities will be used by the tutor to see what you are learning which may include quizzes, question and answer, small projects and discussion
- You will have opportunities to discuss your progress with your tutor
- You will be encouraged to share your work with the group and discuss your learning
- You will be encouraged to consider other students work and give your opinions and suggestions
- The students will be assessed through short oral presentation & homework they are given on a weekly basis.

What else do I need to know? Is there anything I need to bring?

- Students to be given homework

Pre-course work, reading and information sources

- Students could prepare a short oral presentation to introduce themselves & a short presentation about their holidays.

- Students could continue with their french studies by attending a WEA french course
