

1. Prepare a suitable surface on which to begin with a Gesso ground
2. Make small drawings from life to use in studio practice
3. Use paint, brushes, rags or palette knife where appropriate
4. Evolve some conceptual development or technique which furthers an aspect of your personal style

What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class?

- The WEA tutor will use a range of different teaching and learning methods and encourage you and the group to be actively involved in your learning

What kind of feedback can I expect from the tutor?

- You will have opportunities to discuss your progress with your tutor
- You will be encouraged to share your work with the group and discuss your learning
- You will be encouraged to consider other students work and give your opinions and suggestions

What else do I need to know? Is there anything I need to bring?

- It would be helpful if you had access to the internet (Mobile phone, tablet or computer at home or through a library etc.)
- You will need: Paints acrylics, brushes a variety of type, shape and size, rags, painting support, e.g. canvas, hardboard. Pencils, charcoal, masking tape, drawing paper, drawing pins, floor covering. Gesso black and white. A list will be offered.

- A booklist for research will be available but is not required reading to start the course, research on the subject on the internet or in the library may be helpful
