<p>Course Description This course will cover the basics of a range of techniques using paper and printing and will include collage, eco printing, making fabric paper, how to hand dye paper, simple screenprinting, how to make envelopes, make a concertina book and how to make an altered book from an old book</p>
<p>Do I need any particular skills or experience? - No skills or experience needed - This course is suitable for beginners and improvers</p>
<p>What will I achieve? By the end of the course I will be able to: 1. Select natural materials to use to print onto paper 2. Screen-print using an embroidery hoop 3. Use paper to make envelopes 4. Choose a suitable book to make into an altered book 5. Find an image and suitable papers to create a collage</p>
<p>What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class? - The WEA tutor will use a range of different teaching and learning methods and encourage you</p>
