Over the day we will aim to complete a piece of work based on landscape, looking at and discussing artists' work for inspiration.

- A range of informal activities will be used by the tutor to see what you are learning which may include quizzes, question and answer, small projects and discussion
- You will have opportunities to discuss your progress with your tutor
- You will be encouraged to share your work with the group and discuss your learning
- You will be encouraged to consider other students work and give your opinions and suggestions

- A selection of materials and basic equipment will be provided but you are welcome to bring additional materials with you
- You will need to bring some materials that you might want to use for your work. You will also need a board or canvas roughly A3 size or bigger which can be purchased on the day, along with other materials. Please let the course tutor know in advance.
