<p><b>Course Aim</b></p> <p>At the end of this taster day students will have learned how to select and use an image, create a collage from it and learn how this can be used for future textile art</p>
<p><b>Course Description</b></p> <p>Learn how to make and use a simple viewfinder to select an area from an image of your choice, then use this to create a collage based on this image. We will also explore other ways of creating collage as inspiration for textile art.</p>
<p><b>Do I need any particular skills or experience?</b></p>
<p><b>What will I achieve?</b></p> <p><b>By the end of the course I will be able to:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Select and use an image as the starting point for a piece of textile art</li> <li>2. Make and use a viewfinder to focus in on an area in a larger image</li> <li>3. Create a collage from the image selected</li> <li>4. Use 2 different methods to create a collage</li> <li>5. Describe how the collage can be used when creating a piece of textile art</li> </ol>
<p><b>What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class?</b></p> <p>- The WEA tutor will use a range of different teaching and learning methods and encourage you and the group to be actively involved in your learning</p>

### **What kind of feedback can I expect from the tutor?**

- A range of informal activities will be used by the tutor to see what you are learning which may include quizzes, question and answer, small projects and discussion
- You will have opportunities to discuss your progress with your tutor
- You will be encouraged to share your work with the group and discuss your learning
- You will be encouraged to consider other students work and give your opinions and suggestions
