What will I achieve?**By the end of the course I will be able to:**

1. Create a painting based on the theme of fire demonstrating proficiency in observation, use of colour and painting techniques learnt within the course, showing progression
2. Create a painting or drawing on the theme of water demonstrating proficiency in observation, drawing and painting, using techniques learnt within the course, showing progression
3. Create a painting or drawing on the theme of Fur & Feather demonstrating proficiency in observation, drawing and painting, using techniques learnt within the course, showing progression
4. Create a painting or drawing on the theme of dance demonstrating proficiency in observation, drawing and painting, using techniques learnt within the course, showing progression
5. Create a painting of a snow scene demonstrating proficiency in observation, drawing and painting, using techniques learnt within the course, showing progression

What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class?

- The WEA tutor will use a range of different teaching and learning methods and encourage you and the group to be actively involved in your learning

What kind of feedback can I expect from the tutor?

- You will have opportunities to discuss your progress with your tutor
- You will be encouraged to share your work with the group and discuss your learning
- A file of work will be kept which will help to record your progress

- A limited range of materials and basic equipment will be available to support learners each week. Please bring your own additional materials to each session, Further advice regarding materials will be provided at the start of the course.
