Course Aim
 The aim of the course is to train parents to be able to deal with a medical emergency with their child or infant. To understand in a simple way how to deal with an emergency and get help if needed.

Course Description
 The course is open to anybody who looks after children and infants and be able to deal with an emergency from injury to illness. You will get the skills and confidence you need to do a great job when the need arises, through simple theory, practical and discussions. The course is easy to understand and is delivered in a relaxed and friendly environment.

Do I need any particular skills or experience?

What will I achieve?
By the end of the course I will be able to:

1. Have the skills to identify and deal with an emergency
2. Have the confidence to deal with an emergency from an injury to an illness

3. Use a first aid kit or an alternative effectively and safely
4. Get help when you feel you are unable to do any more

What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class?

- The WEA tutor will use a range of different teaching and learning methods and encourage you and the group to be actively involved in your learning
 - Theory knowledge with power-point presentations
- DVD showing how to deal with an emergency
- Practicals to develop hands on skills in the class and practice outside the class

What kind of feedback can I expect from the tutor?

- A range of informal activities will be used by the tutor to see what you are learning which may include quizzes, question and answer, small projects and discussion
- You will have opportunities to discuss your progress with your tutor
- You will be encouraged to consider other students work and give your opinions and suggestions

What else do I need to know? Is there anything I need to bring?

- All materials will be provided
 - A selection of materials and basic equipment will be provided but you are welcome to bring additional materials with you
 - A notebook and pen to take notes you will find useful and can refer to at a later date.
- A basic handout is provided to reinforce knowledge.
