



3. Give an account of the style of the essays

#### **What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class?**

- You may be asked to undertake additional work in your own time to support your learning
- The course will involve you reading one or two essays by Orwell in your own time and coming along prepared to talk about what you have read

#### **What kind of feedback can I expect from the tutor?**

- You will have opportunities to discuss your progress with your tutor
- You will be encouraged to share your work with the group and discuss your learning

#### **What else do I need to know? Is there anything I need to bring?**

- You will need to bring along a book of Orwell's Essays, preferably the Penguin Modern Classics edition edited by Bernard Crick

#### **Pre-course work, reading and information sources**
