Course Aim

The course is to provide learners a brief introduction into using charcoal as a drawing medium.

Course Description

This taster course offers a brief introduction to working with charcoal as a drawing medium. You will have the chance to explore the possibilities of mark making using charcoal and the way in which it can be used to create tone (light and shade) within a drawing.

Do I need any particular skills or experience?

What will I achieve?

By the end of the course I will be able to:

1. Produce one charcoal drawing.
2. Be able to create tone (light and shade) in a drawing.
3. Be able to create a variety of marks within a drawing using charcoal.
4. Reflect on their own achievements.

- Materials required will be - charcoal sticks, A3 cartridge paper, 2 sheets of tracing paper, a rubber. A3 board to rest paper on (optional), some learners may wish to work flat on the table in front of computer if space allows, masking tape.
