Course Aim <p>This course is about Applique and during the course we will be trying different methods of applying fabric to fabric, by hand and using the sewing machine</p>
Course Description <p>You will learn different the effects of Applique using many different fabrics, both by hand and by sewing machine items to be made up into Bags, Cushions and other items for use in the home.</p>
Do I need any particular skills or experience? <ul style="list-style-type: none">- This course is suitable for beginners and improvers- a certain manual dexterity is needed to perform some of the techniques used.
What will I achieve? <p>By the end of the course I will be able to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. How to transfer designs on to fabric.2. How to use a material called Bondaweb3. hand methods of needle turning4. using the sewing machine different stitches5. Make up techniques and finishing.
What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class? <ul style="list-style-type: none">- The WEA tutor will use a range of different teaching and learning methods and encourage you

and the group to be actively involved in your learning

- You will be expected to carry out a range of activities in your own time

What kind of feedback can I expect from the tutor?

- A range of informal activities will be used by the tutor to see what you are learning which may include quizzes, question and answer, small projects and discussion
- You will have opportunities to discuss your progress with your tutor
- You will be encouraged to share your work with the group and discuss your learning
- You will be encouraged to consider other students work and give your opinions and suggestions
- You will be asked to keep an A4 folder with your patterns and templates

- It is hoped that you will bring in your own materials from which to work.
