- The students will be able to express their views & opinions on all kind of subjects. Learners will also be given homework on a weekly basis.

What kind of feedback can I expect from the tutor?

- A range of informal activities will be used by the tutor to see what you are learning which may include quizzes, question and answer, small projects and discussion
- You will have opportunities to discuss your progress with your tutor
- You will be encouraged to share your work with the group and discuss your learning
- You will be encouraged to consider other students work and give your opinions and suggestions
- There will be a number of tasks such as oral presentations, role plays, group discussions & homework on grammatical points.

What else do I need to know? Is there anything I need to bring?

- Students to be given homework on a weekly basis & to do a short presentation on a topic of their choice each week.

Pre-course work, reading and information sources

- Students could read French news by consulting BBC website.

- Progress to another WEA course
- The students could continue their French studies by attending another WEA French course.
