2. Understand what is required of me if I decide to take a national qualification exam in this language.
3. Access further materials for self-study.
4. Be more confident in a community learning environment such as this.
5. Understand (listening/reading) and produce (speaking/writing) the language at a low intermediate level.

What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class?

- The WEA tutor will use a range of different teaching and learning methods and encourage you and the group to be actively involved in your learning
- You may be asked to undertake additional work in your own time to support your learning

What kind of feedback can I expect from the tutor?

- A range of informal activities will be used by the tutor to see what you are learning which may include quizzes, question and answer, small projects and discussion
- You will have opportunities to discuss your progress with your tutor
- You will be encouraged to share your work with the group and discuss your learning
- You will be encouraged to consider other students work and give your opinions and suggestions
- A file of work will be kept which will help to record your progress
- There will be a number of tasks appropriate to your course such as written work, creating art or craft, video, photography or small projects. Some of these may be marked to help you progress

- All materials will be provided
- A selection of materials and basic equipment will be provided but you are welcome to bring additional materials with you
