## Course Description

The group will work together demonstrating their creative storytelling skills and technical filmmaking skills learned in the last two courses. Members will be given the opportunity to star in their films and deliver their messages first hand.

## What will I achieve?

### By the end of the course I will be able to:

1. Understand and demonstrate advanced ways of contributing to the creative process of an advocacy film.
2. Take part in working with a group to deliver an important message to an uninformed audience.
3. Develop technical filmmaking skills further and make important practical and editorial decisions with the class based on knowledge gained in the previous course.
4. To use own individual skills on screen to deliver an important message, working on understanding and devising different unique ways to deliver a message.

### **What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class?**

- The WEA tutor will use a range of different teaching and learning methods and encourage you and the group to be actively involved in your learning

### **What kind of feedback can I expect from the tutor?**

- A range of informal activities will be used by the tutor to see what you are learning which may include quizzes, question and answer, small projects and discussion
- You will have opportunities to discuss your progress with your tutor
- You will be encouraged to share your work with the group and discuss your learning
- You will be encouraged to consider other students work and give your opinions and suggestions
- A file of work will be kept which will help to record your progress
- There will be a number of tasks appropriate to your course such as written work, creating art or craft, video, photography or small projects. Some of these may be marked to help you progress
