

1. Display a variety of pencil drawing techniques.
2. Use 'lifting off' methods in a charcoal drawing.
3. Draw with coloured pencils.
4. Have completed a variety of drawings.
5. Feel confident about my drawing choices.

What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class?

- The WEA tutor will use a range of different teaching and learning methods and encourage you and the group to be actively involved in your learning
- Drawing and painting at home is encouraged, but not required. Work can be brought in for appraisal.

What kind of feedback can I expect from the tutor?

- A range of informal activities will be used by the tutor to see what you are learning which may include quizzes, question and answer, small projects and discussion
- You will have opportunities to discuss your progress with your tutor
- You will be encouraged to share your work with the group and discuss your learning
- You will be encouraged to consider other students work and give your opinions and suggestions
- There will be a number of tasks appropriate to your course such as written work, creating art or craft, video, photography or small projects. Some of these may be marked to help you progress
- Students may choose to purchase a small portfolio to store work; to show evidence of their progress.

What else do I need to know? Is there anything I need to bring?

- Nothing else is needed
- All materials will be provided
- A selection of materials and basic equipment will be provided but you are welcome to bring additional materials with you
- There is free WiFi at this venue and students are welcome to research the subject and search for source imagery.

- No pre reading is required but research on the subject on the internet or in the library may be helpful
