Course Description For students who may have some prior knowledge of drawing and/or painting but who would like to extend their skills and or style through colour, colour theory, layering and texture.

What will I achieve? By the end of the course I will be able to: 1. Have a basic understanding of colour theory 2. How to successfully apply colour to create depth and texture

3. Gain a new perspective in my approach to drawing/painting
