



1. Use a core vocabulary (slightly bigger than that required for GCSE Latin) of about 500 words
2. Show progress in a topic of Latin grammar to be chosen by the class
3. Show progress in a topic of Latin syntax to be chosen by the class
4. Use previously learnt basics of Latin more confidently and accurately.
5. Feel more confident in tackling extended passages of Latin for translation.

**What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class?**

- The WEA tutor will use a range of different teaching and learning methods and encourage you and the group to be actively involved in your learning
- You may be asked to undertake additional work in your own time to support your learning

**What kind of feedback can I expect from the tutor?**

- A range of informal activities will be used by the tutor to see what you are learning which may include quizzes, question and answer, small projects and discussion
- You will have opportunities to discuss your progress with your tutor
- You will be encouraged to share your work with the group and discuss your learning
- You will be encouraged to consider other students work and give your opinions and suggestions
- You will be given the option of submitting written work to the tutor which will be returned with written feedback

**What else do I need to know? Is there anything I need to bring?**

- A selection of materials and basic equipment will be provided but you are welcome to bring additional materials with you
- It is desirable - but not essential - that students have their own concise grammar and dictionary for reference. The tutor will be happy to advise on the choice.

**Pre-course work, reading and information sources**

- No pre reading is required but research on the subject on the internet or in the library may be helpful
- No preparation is essential though obviously revision of previously learnt Latin will increase students' confidence.

**Possible next steps after this course including career opportunities if appropriate**

- Progress to another WEA course
- Progress to a course with another provider
- Become involved as a volunteer for a WEA partner or another organisation
