<p>Course Description This course is designed to help students to communicate successfully. Integrated skills lessons are full of different types of activities (pair and group work activities, brainstorming, open discussions and others) to maximise your opportunities for practising the language in class and outside the class. The course covers the following topics: Get Started, Problems, problems, What's different?, A good match, A secret life, Bad Habits, You are what you eat, How to feed your kids, Applying for a job, Working life. The course has a strong focus on developing your conversational skills, covering the areas of grammar, vocabulary, reading, writing and listening appropriate to the level and improving your job skills alongside.</p>
