Course Aim
Learn about the life, work and times of Henri Matisse. Examine his wide-ranging oeuvre including drawings, paintings, sculpture, cut-outs and chapel decoration.

Course Description
Discover the life and varied artwork of Henri Matisse, one of the greatest artists of 20th century Europe. We will explore the multiple influences upon his artwork, from the impressionists to Islamic decoration.

What will I achieve?
By the end of the course I will be able to:
1. Examine the artworks studied and comment upon them.
2. Relate Matisse's artworks to his life and times.
3. Apply questions when viewing an artwork in order to develop your own interpretation.

What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class?
- The WEA tutor will use a range of different teaching and learning methods and encourage you and the group to be actively involved in your learning

What kind of feedback can I expect from the tutor?

- A range of informal activities will be used by the tutor to see what you are learning which may include quizzes, question and answer, small projects and discussion
- You will be encouraged to develop skills of art appreciation and evaluation.
