Course Aim

In this course students will gain skills for making sculptures out of paper mache. They will explore different techniques to construct 3D objects and then paint and decorate them.

Course Description

In this course you will make sculptures from paper mache, paper pulp and wire mesh. With my guidance you will create objects, such as colourful animals, decorative bowls, etc. Priming, painting and decorating are the final stages in this process.

What will I achieve?

By the end of the course I will be able to:

1. Build a basic 3D structure with newsprint, cardboard, tape and wire mesh
2. Demonstrate how to create a solid surface from paper strips and paste
3. Use a primer, acrylic paint and other materials for surface decoration

What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class?

- The WEA tutor will use a range of different teaching and learning methods and encourage you and the group to be actively involved in your learning
- You will be expected to carry out a range of activities in your own time

What kind of feedback can I expect from the tutor?

- A range of informal activities will be used by the tutor to see what you are learning which may include quizzes, question and answer, small projects and discussion
- You will have opportunities to discuss your progress with your tutor
- You will be encouraged to share your work with the group and discuss your learning
- You will be encouraged to consider other students work and give your opinions and suggestions
- There will be a number of tasks appropriate to your course such as written work, creating art or craft, video, photography or small projects. Some of these may be marked to help you progress

What else do I need to know? Is there anything I need to bring?

- All materials will be provided
- A selection of materials and basic equipment will be provided but you are welcome to bring additional materials with you
- Students may bring images that they base their sculptures on. They are also encouraged to recycle materials from home in their art works.
