<p>Course Description Wire is a lovely medium to introduce you to working in 3D. We will explore how to shape and join wire, drawing with wire and creating decorative, 3D work. The wires used are soft and easy to work, making them an ideal medium for the beginner.</p>
<p>Do I need any particular skills or experience? - No skills or experience needed - This course is suitable for beginners and improvers</p>
<p>What will I achieve? By the end of the course I will be able to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Learn to shape and join wire to create delicate shapes 2. Explore drawing with wire 3. Manipulate and form coloured wires to make decorative objects
<p>What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class? - The WEA tutor will use a range of different teaching and learning methods and encourage you and the group to be actively involved in your learning</p>
