Course Aim
To learn basic skills in creating, cutting a pattern and sewing. To produce a wearable garment. To develop confidence and encourage progression.

Course Description
The course will cover taking body measurements, transferring measurements onto the fabric by using mathematical skills, creating a pattern and stitching the garment. Students will develop skills that will enable them to consider other pathways and opportunities.

Do I need any particular skills or experience?

What will I achieve?
By the end of the course I will be able to:

1. to take body measurements confidently.
2. to create a pattern by applying the measurements taken.
3. to stitch and complete the full outfit confidently.
4. use sewing machines, and other related sewing equipment, safely and effectively within health and safety guidelines
5. Build confidence

What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class?

- The WEA tutor will use a range of different teaching and learning methods and encourage you and the group to be actively involved in your learning
- You may be asked to undertake additional work in your own time to support your learning
- You will be expected to carry out a range of activities in your own time

What kind of feedback can I expect from the tutor?

- A range of informal activities will be used by the tutor to see what you are learning which may include quizzes, question and answer, small projects and discussion
- You will have opportunities to discuss your progress with your tutor
- You will be encouraged to share your work with the group and discuss your learning
- You will be encouraged to consider other students work and give your opinions and suggestions
