## **Course Aim**

To introduce the students to the variety and distinctive features of European Art Nouveau focussing on selected works of art and architecture produced in countries such as Belgium and France, Austria and England.

## **Course Description**

The study day provides an introduction to the art and architecture produced in Europe between 1890 and 1914. Inspired by the natural world artists aimed to create works appropriate for the modern world and established a style based on sinuous lines, elongated forms and the use of exotic materials. Mucha and Gaudi, Horta and Beardsley, Mackintosh and Toulouse-Lutrec are among the artists to be considered.
