Course Aim

The course will give you an insight into the world of pockets to send you on your way with a broader knowledge, confidence and a reference file to accompany your future sewing.

Course Description

This 4 week course will explore Just Pockets! Each week you will follow a structured lesson following a step by step demonstration. You will make your own pattern and construct your own pocket sample. You will create a pattern and sample for a patch pocket, bellows pocket, side pocket and welt pocket. The course will give you an insight into the world of pockets to send you on your way with a broader knowledge, confidence and a reference file to accompany your future sewing. In this course you will follow the structure and there will be no personal project sewing.

Do I need any particular skills or experience?

What will I achieve?

By the end of the course I will be able to:

1. Use the sewing machine, iron and overlocker safely
2. Watch demonstration and create a patch pocket with flap
3. Watch demonstration and create a bellows pocket
4. Watch demonstration and create a side pocket

5. Watch demonstration and create a single welt pocket

What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class?

- The WEA tutor will use a range of different teaching and learning methods and encourage you and the group to be actively involved in your learning

What kind of feedback can I expect from the tutor?

- A range of informal activities will be used by the tutor to see what you are learning which may include quizzes, question and answer, small projects and discussion
- You will have opportunities to discuss your progress with your tutor
- A file of work will be kept which will help to record your progress
