



1. identify relevant historical events which impacted on East Anglians during this period
2. examine and analyse source materials on musters and draw conclusions from them
3. be able to share in group discussions on the material evidence of defences
4. apply your knowledge to new materials and use the evidence to draw reasoned conclusions
