Course Description

Anyone who is interested in learning or improving reading skills by exploring the sound of letters (phonics) and recognising letter patterns with words. This will be achieved by working in a friendly relaxing atmosphere at a pace that meets the needs of the individual or group and will have support in small group of similar abilities

What will I achieve?

By the end of the course I will be able to:

1. Recognise words on sight, length, shape, letter combinations
2. Recognise sounds and letter
3. Use different techniques for learning to read word on sight

- The WEA tutor will use a range of different teaching and learning methods and encourage you and the group to be actively involved in your learning

What kind of feedback can I expect from the tutor?

- A range of informal activities will be used by the tutor to see what you are learning which may include quizzes, question and answer, small projects and discussion
- You will have opportunities to discuss your progress with your tutor
- A file of work will be kept which will help to record your progress
