Course Aim
This course will introduce learners to the art of felt making to create personal variations on the course themes. 3d felting Flowers, bugs and birds; 2d felting images for wall hangings, placemats etc

Course Description
We will make individual crafted pieces (flowers, pea pods and leaves) using wet felting techniques that will be put together to make mobiles or 3d wall hangings. Individuals will explore different techniques to fashion a variety of flora; working with different colour combinations to learn about colour mixing. Discover more about the natural world is key to this course helping with communication, and ultimately to build confidence in personal choices. The different individual felted parts will be crafted together using different textile techniques (embroidery, Appliqué, stitch) to make larger pieces of work or conversely working in detail to make smaller jewellery like accessories. Fun for everyone, enabling a wide variety skills that could be the start of a new way of working.

1. to work with colour confidently

2. share ideas and skills
3. make two different examples of wet-felted flora
4. sew and applique
5. use the correct terminology
