<p><b>Course Aim</b></p> <p>Students will create various seasonal projects using textile and paper crafts, both for personal use and to be displayed around the home.</p>
<p><b>Course Description</b></p> <p>Students will make various projects using both paper and textile crafts. During the first half of the course, projects will have a summery theme – such as ice lolly felt keyrings and paper bag making for summer parties. During the second half of the course, projects will have an autumnal theme – such as leaf printing and felt cushions.</p>

Students will create felt projects, such as ice lolly keyrings.</li> <li>2. Students will create projects to be used for events/parties, such as paper bags.</li> <li>3. Students will create projects using nature, such as leaf printing.</li> <li>4. Students will create fabric projects, such as felt cushions.</li> </ol>
