Course Description

Students will gain the knowledge then demonstrate their skills through practical activities. Students will work in pairs and gain skills that will enable them to progress to an accredited course and then on to employment

What will I achieve?

By the end of the course I will be able to:

- 1. Identify 5 contra indications to an eye treatment
- 2. Set up the working area for an eye treatment
- 3. hold a client / therapist consultation and write to complete a client record card
- 4. Give aftercare advice for a wax treatment
- 5. Describe why a patch test would be carried out and perform a patch test

What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class?

- The WEA tutor will use a range of different teaching and learning methods and encourage you and the group to be actively involved in your learning

What kind of feedback can I expect from the tutor?

- A range of informal activities will be used by the tutor to see what you are learning which may include quizzes, question and answer, small projects and discussion
- You will have opportunities to discuss your progress with your tutor
- You will be encouraged to share your work with the group and discuss your learning
- You will be encouraged to consider other students work and give your opinions and suggestions
- There will be a number of tasks appropriate to your course such as written work, creating art or craft, video, photography or small projects. Some of these may be marked to help you progress
