Demonstrations and contextual hand-outs will be provided throughout, alongside 1-2-1 support and discussion. Bring pencils, A3 paper/sketchbook and a rubber to the first session. Details and advice about brushes and acrylic paints will be given after the first few sessions.

By the end of the course I will be able to:

1. Develop drawing skills
2. Develop painting skills
3. Produce a final piece (drawing or painting)
4. Develop greater confidence in your drawing and painting skills
5. Learn new approaches to drawing and painting

- The WEA tutor will use a range of different teaching and learning methods and encourage you and the group to be actively involved in your learning

What kind of feedback can I expect from the tutor?

- You will have opportunities to discuss your progress with your tutor

- You will be encouraged to consider other students work and give your opinions and suggestions
