<b>Course Description</b> Continuing on from part 1, this course will begin with Tudor Northamptonshire, through the English Civil War up to the Victorians including the story of the Northamptonshire Regiment.

<b>What will I achieve?</b> <b>By the end of the course I will be able to:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Summarise the importance of Northampton and Northamptonshire in the history of the UK</li><li>2. Explain significant events related to Northamptonshire</li><li>3. Identify and list sites of historical importance in the county</li><li>4. Identify the unique characteristics of Northants, articulating causality, and analyse change over time.</li><li>5. Summarise diversity in Northamptonshire throughout its history</li></ol>

### **What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class?**

- The WEA tutor will use a range of different teaching and learning methods and encourage you and the group to be actively involved in your learning

### **What kind of feedback can I expect from the tutor?**

- A range of informal activities will be used by the tutor to see what you are learning which may include quizzes, question and answer, small projects and discussion
