<p>Course Aim The aim of this course is to teach you the principles of driving theory.</p>
<p>Course Description The WEA Driving Test Theory course contains everything you need to know in order to prepare for, and pass, the UK Driving Theory Test. Passing this two-part test is essential if you are looking to obtain a driving licence, you need to make sure you are familiar with the syllabus and feel confident in tackling both parts of the test. This course addresses not only the key content of the theory test syllabus, but also gives you the skills you need in order to retain the material, link it to your practical driving experience and control your nerves before the test. In addition, you will also gain a head start on preparing for your practical test. The course will allow you to become a safe, confident driver who is equipped to handle a range of situations on the road.</p>

By the end of the course I will be able to:

1. Give you a brief overview of the contents and purpose of the UK Driving Theory Test
2. Learn how to retain the knowledge that you will need, in order to pass the test
3. Build confidence with the theory involved with driving in the UK
4. Create an understanding of the multi-choice questions and what they are asking
5. Improve your knowledge with identifying the hazards involved with driving

What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class?

- The WEA tutor will use a range of different teaching and learning methods and encourage you and the group to be actively involved in your learning
- You may be asked to undertake additional work in your own time to support your learning
- You will be expected to carry out a range of activities in your own time

What kind of feedback can I expect from the tutor?

- A range of informal activities will be used by the tutor to see what you are learning which may include quizzes, question and answer, small projects and discussion
- You will have opportunities to discuss your progress with your tutor
- You will be encouraged to share your work with the group and discuss your learning

- A file of work will be kept which will help to record your progress
