You will learn how to treat and condition materials, how to make handtie bouquets, wiring techniques, make arrangements for the home. Presentation skills with wrapping and ribbons. This course can help anyone who would like to gain employment within the floristry industry , the course gives you the opportunity to work within the community , arranging flowers for charity events this course will help you to gain confidence to work independently.</p>

<p>What will I achieve? By the end of the course I will be able to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Learn how to condition and the treatments needed for flowers and foliage. 2. How to apply principle elements for designs

3. You will learn presentation skills.
4. Making themed florals with spring flowers
5. Learning basic wiring techniques, and ribbon folding.
