Course Aim This courses aims to develop your knowledge of food safety. It is aimed at students who may be preparing for or are new to a work role that involves handling food within health and social care, early years and childcare settings.		
Course Description During this course you will focus on food safety requirements, how you can contribute to and/or promote nutrition and hydration and how best to support individuals to eat and drink. You will work towards the NCFE Cache Level 2 award in Food safety in Health & Social care & early years & childcare settings. You will need to be in work, volunteering or on practical placement to complete the qualification and will be assessed through observation and written tasks.		
Do I need any particular skills or experience?		
What will I achieve? By the end of the course I will be able to: 1. Highlight the importance of food safety measures when providing food and drink for individuals.		

2. Recognise how to maintain hygiene when handling food and drink.
3. Identify how to store food and drink safely.
4. Demonstrate how to meet safety requirements when preparing and serving food and drink for individuals.
5. Identify how to access additional advice or support about food safety.

What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class?

- The WEA's digital learning platform, Canvas will be used to provide resources or to support lessons, enable assessment, provide learner feedback and for other activities for individuals away from the course. - The WEA tutor will use a range of different teaching and learning methods and encourage you and the group to be actively involved in your learning
- You will be expected to carry out a range of activities in your own time
- Activities may include tutor presentation, small group work, working in pairs, class discussions, short tasks and research

What kind of feedback can I expect from the tutor?

- You will be able to keep a record of your progress and achievement using photos, audio, text or documents uploaded into the WEA's digital learning platform, WEA Canvas.
- Your tutor will provide written, text and audio feedback recorded in WEA Canvas, WEA's digital learning platform.
- You will be able to keep a digital portfolio of your work on WEA's digital learning platform, Canvas.
- A range of informal activities will be used by the tutor to see what you are learning which may include quizzes, question and answer, small projects and discussion
- You will have opportunities to discuss your progress with your tutor
- You will be encouraged to share your work with the group and discuss your learning
- A file of work will be kept which will help to record your progress

- You will also need access to the internet outside of your sessions. You could do this using a smart phone, tablet, laptop or a desktop computer (at home or through a library etc.).
