Course Aim

This course will enable you to communicate in Spanish at a basic level, to discover more about Spanish speaking cultures and to encourage further study of the language, history and culture of the Spanish speaking world.

Course Description

This course builds on two previous WEA Spanish Beginners courses, so some knowledge of basic vocabulary and language structure is needed if you are joining for the first time. The emphasis is on using the language in everyday situations when visiting Spanish speaking countries. This is achieved through the repetition of key phrases, the use of themed, structured role play exercises and listening to audio material spoken by native speakers.

Do I need any particular skills or experience?

What will I achieve?

By the end of the course I will be able to:

1. Ask about and understand how to use public transport in Spain.
2. Make a complaint in a hotel or restaurant.
3. Describe simple ailments and ask for remedies.

What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class?

- The WEA tutor will use a range of different teaching and learning methods and encourage you and the group to be actively involved in your learning
- You may be asked to undertake additional work in your own time to support your learning

What kind of feedback can I expect from the tutor?

- A range of informal activities will be used by the tutor to see what you are learning which may include quizzes, question and answer, small projects and discussion
- You will have opportunities to discuss your progress with your tutor
- You will be encouraged to share your work with the group and discuss your learning
- A file of work will be kept which will help to record your progress

What else do I need to know? Is there anything I need to bring?

- It would be helpful if you had access to the internet (Mobile phone, tablet or computer at home or through a library etc.)
- A file with paper, dividers and a pen will be needed. A small Spanish-English dictionary and simple phrase book would be useful.

Pre-course work, reading and information sources

- No pre reading or pre course work is required
- Research on the topics to be studied may be helpful.

Possible next steps after this course (including career opportunities if appropriate)

- Progress to another WEA course
- Progress to a course with another provider
- Become involved with the WEA in a range of voluntary work and other activities including campaigning as a WEA member
- Become involved as a volunteer for a WEA partner or another organisation
