What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class?

What kind of feedback can I expect from the tutor?

- There is a Canvas Quiz following each session which students are encouraged to take as a check on their own progress.
- The tutor will provide feedback to individuals during and after the sessions, if the number of students requesting such a response is not prohibitively high!

What else do I need to know? Is there anything I need to bring?

 - You will also need access to the internet outside of your sessions. You could do this using a smart phone, tablet, laptop or a desktop computer (at home or through a library etc.).
 - You will need a personal email address to join the WEA's digital learning platform, Canvas so that you can receive resources, record your progress and achievement and to work with others and share ideas.
