Course Description

You will be taken through a step by step guide as to the equipment needed and the process of making a simple mosaic stepping stone.

Demonstrations will be given showing the indirect mosaic method, necessary for a flat surface. You will be able to make your own mosaic stepping stone in your own time.

- For the demonstration bring a pen and paper to take notes. To enable you to make the mosaic stepping stone in your own time you will need: brown parcel paper, tile nippers (or hammer), PVA glue, a mould such as a plastic plant pot saucer, broken china, tiles, etc, ready mixed concrete.
