Course Aim To develop the student's ability to converse in and understand simple Italian when visiting Italy.
Course Description You will learn how to communicate in everyday situations, including introducing yourself, saying where you are from, introducing others, ordering, accepting and refusing drinks, getting directions, and learning numbers. The main aim is communication, and grammar is introduced as an aid to further understanding and using the language. This is the first of three terms, and you will be able to continue on to terms 2 and 3 if you wish to.

What will I achieve?

By the end of the course I will be able to:

1. greet people - say hello, goodbye, and introduce yourself
2. say where you come from - your home town/country - and your occupation
3. introduce other people, talk about your family and friends, and state their ages
4. order, accept and refuse drinks in a bar/cafe
5. understand and use the numbers 0 - 100

What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class?

- You may be asked to undertake additional work in your own time to support your learning

- You will be able to keep a record of your progress and achievement using photos, audio, text or documents uploaded into the WEA's digital learning platform, WEA Canvas.
- A range of informal activities will be used by the tutor to see what you are learning which may include quizzes, question and answer, small projects and discussion
- You will have opportunities to discuss your progress with your tutor
- You will be encouraged to share your work with the group and discuss your learning
- You will be encouraged to consider other students work and give your opinions and suggestions

- You will also need access to the internet outside of your sessions. You could do this using a smart phone, tablet, laptop or a desktop computer (at home or through a library etc.).
