## Course Aim

Expand and improve your watercolour practice through the study of flora and fauna.

## Course Description

Expand and improve your watercolour practice by observing natural flora and fauna. Learn a variety of watercolour techniques and experiment with applying these to build subtle tonal and colour combinations. Experiment with body colour and pigment to express opaque qualities and discover how to apply mark making to create delicate detail. Each week will build upon your skills and combine these to expand your knowledge of how artists have composed and arranged natural subjects. You will be encouraged to produce your own portfolio of work and complete weekly tasks to build confidence and develop your own watercolour painting style.

#### **By the end of the course I will be able to:**

1. use a variety of watercolour techniques and themes
2. apply body colour and light washes to establish form
3. use dry brush techniques to build subtle tonal and colour combinations
4. experiment with body colour and pigment to express opaque qualities
5. apply mark making to create delicate detail
