Course Description

This course will bring together everything you have learned at Entry level, and enable you to communicate effectively and listen for new and relevant information in a wide range of everyday and formal situations. We will look at how we adapt our communication depending on who we are talking to, and the importance of body language and facial expressions in face to face situations.

Do I need any particular skills or experience?

What will I achieve?

By the end of the course I will be able to:

1. To give a short presentation on a given subject using an appropriate level of formality.
2. Use conditionals to talk about a range of possible and impossible situations (using if/unless).
3. Ask for and give advice or suggestions in a range of common situations.
4. Explain your personal views clearly in a range of topical discussions.
5. Listen and respond appropriately, using information about the situation and the speaker.

What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class?
