<p>Course Aim This course is for people who want to know what action to take in an emergency and how to deal effectively with accidents and injuries.</p>
<p>Course Description This course will give people the knowledge needed to act competently in an emergency. The course covers both adult, child and baby first aid. The course will be of interest to anyone, for example, parents, grandparents, and babysitters. The course will guide students through how to deal with different kinds of illnesses and accidents. The course will cover a range emergencies which may involve young children and babies, for example, asthma, meningitis, choking and febrile seizures. Students will be shown the modifications needed to carry out CPR on both adults and children. The course will also cover dealing with chest pain, major bleeding, head injuries, allergic reaction, broken bones plus much more. Students will also learn how to deal with the emergency services. The course will be taught in a relaxed and friendly way, using video, discussion and other online activities to help students gain the knowledge they need to act quickly and effectively in a medical emergency.</p>
<p>Do I need any particular skills or experience?</p>
<p>What will I achieve? By the end of the course I will be able to:</p>

1. Identify, safe and effective methods for adult, child and baby resuscitation.
2. How to deal with those who are experiencing chest pain.
3. How to deal effectively with a choking adult, baby or child.
4. How to deal with an unresponsive casualty.
5. How to deal competently with different forms of major and minor illnesses and accidents.

What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class?

- You will be able to keep a record of your progress and achievement using photos, audio, text or documents uploaded into the WEA's digital learning platform, WEA Canvas.
- A range of informal activities will be used by the tutor to see what you are learning which may include quizzes, question and answer, small projects and discussion
- You will have opportunities to discuss your progress with your tutor
- You will be encouraged to share your work with the group and discuss your learning
- You will be encouraged to consider other students work and give your opinions and suggestions
