This ESOL course is for beginners. It will help you to develop basic speaking, listening, reading and writing skill in English.

Course Description

In this ESOL class we will talk about our everyday lives (for example, shopping, health, where you live). You will start to learn about the alphabet and numbers. You will practise asking for and giving basic personal information about yourself. You will learn new words and start to develop your reading and skills.

Do I need any particular skills or experience?

What will I achieve?

By the end of the course I will be able to:

1. Read, write and say the numbers 1 -10
2. Read, write and spell aloud my name in English

3. Ask for and answer simple questions about basic personal information
4. Sight read signs, symbols, words on forms and personal key words

What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class?

- You will do lots of different activities with examples from real life situations
- You will work together with other students and the tutor, as well as working on your own.
Your tutor will give you homework

What kind of feedback can I expect from the tutor?

- Your tutor will help you to set targets for your learning.
- Your tutor will give you regular friendly feedback about your progress.

What else do I need to know? Is there anything I need to bring?
