



### **What will I achieve?**

#### **By the end of the course I will be able to:**

1. Use a vocabulary to describe the relationship between poetry and visual works of art.
2. Enhance your recognition of the functions behind poetry and art produced in Europe and North America.
3. Begin to recognise intrinsic and extrinsic engagements for visual art works in relation to poetry.
4. Begin to recognise the variety of practices in the visual responses to poetry.
5. Consider the contexts for many examples of poetry and visual art.

### **What teaching methods will be used and will there be work outside of the class?**

- The WEA's digital learning platform, Canvas will be used to provide resources or to support lessons, enable assessment, provide learner feedback and for other activities for individuals away from the course. - The WEA tutor will use a range of different teaching and learning methods and encourage you and the group to be actively involved in your learning
- Students are provided with a detailed itinerary of works displayed and discussed at each session. Extracts from some of the poetry discussed will be available on the Canvas site. The tutor provides a weekly online web page, giving the content from the previous sessions.

### **What kind of feedback can I expect from the tutor?**

- You will be able to keep a record of your progress and achievement using photos, audio, text or documents uploaded into the WEA's digital learning platform, WEA Canvas.
- You will be able to keep a digital portfolio of your work on WEA's digital learning platform, Canvas.
- A file of work will be kept which will help to record your progress
- The course will use self-assessment, agreed by the tutor, using a prepared form. The tutor will give indications of how students might improve their skills.

### **What else do I need to know? Is there anything I need to bring?**
